## **California Proposition 65**

California's Proposition 65, officially known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (<a href="https://oehha.ca.gov/proposition-65">https://oehha.ca.gov/proposition-65</a>) protects the state's drinking water sources from being contaminated with chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm, and requires businesses to inform Californians about exposures to such chemicals. By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the **exposure** is low enough to pose no significant risk of **cancer** or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other **reproductive** harm.

The listed chemical substances known to be contained in the PCBs are below the OEHHA "Safe Harbour Levels" with the exception of Nickel for which no Safe Harbour Level has been posted. Very small amounts of Nickel can be found in the PCB if it includes Hard, Soft or Immersion Gold (thin layer of nickel is specified for under the gold), or in some lead-free HASL alloys, or as trace element in electrodeposited copper foils.
